

after giving thirty days' notice. People of the districts may petition against the establishment of such stores, in which case the board must delay action until a vote on the subject has been taken and then decide with the majority.

City districts have a right to vote out stores at any time and people of other districts may vote out a store after the expiration of two years from its establishment. Under the proposed new law, no liquor will be sold to persons; under 21 years of age. No person except an employee of the board is allowed to sell beer of any strength. The maximum purchase of each person is a quart of liquor, two gallons of wine, or MINING AROUND four gallons of beer in any one MINING AROUND of liquor, two gallons of wine, or day.
