Whale meat looks and tastes like beef. The use of whale meat for human consumption is by no means a new institution. The old-time American whalermen out of Nantucket and New Bedford regaled themselves on tasty whale scraps while they were trying out the carcase for oil.

The catching and canning of whale meat is now a recognized Canadian industry on the Pacific Coast, and two stations and canneries are located on Vancouver Island's west coast, and shipments of canned whale meat are being sent to the European and Oriental markets in increasing quantities.

The Japanese especially are very fond of whale meat. A deli\_ cacy in Japan is salted whale tails and nearly every Japanese liner that leaves this port from now until the end of the fall will take out small consignments of salted whale tails.
