EDMONTON UTILITIES SHOW A LARGE PROFIT

Street Railway Loses Money But Others Combined Show Good Surplus

EDMONTON, July 26.—Operation of city utilities during the month of June yielded a net surplus above operating costs and depreciation charges of a little over thirteen thousand dollars, a little increase over the profits for the corresponding month of last year.

The street railway showed a deficit of between nine and ten thousand dollars while all others combined showed a profit of \$22,435.

For the first six months of the year the net surplus on all utilities was \$182,726.
