While in Smithers Miss Lauder saw considerable of the surrounding country on motor trips and prophesied a great future for that country in mixed farming and sheep raising. Speaking of sheep raising Miss Lauder said that in the south, around Kamloops, considerable money was being made in sheep raising, summer ranging on government grazing areas being on a community plan basis. There, several sheep raisers would pool their flocks, amounting to some 2,000 head or more. which would be under the care of a herder and would be properly taken care of on the higher graz\_ ing areas. For a man with say a few hundred sheep it was impossible for him to look after them properly and with the expense of fencing against coyotes and too much of a financial drain on the small man. In the co-operative grazing system the small man could easily pay a slight assessment per head for the raising of his flock and have them summer months. Miss Lauder considers the northern country well suited to sheep raising from a geographical standpoint.


