#### Log Embargo Is Much Discussed.

There is a strong feeling among a large section of the community that the embargo on logs should be a fast and permanent one, and that anyone wishing to use the logs should do so on this side of the boundary line. There is even criticism heard from time to time of allowing big squares to be exported.

Those more intimately connected with the lumber industry are inclined to oppose that idea. They point to many cases where hardships to loggers in making their employment less permanent would also follow.

Because of the differences in opinion, the session of the commission here on Thursday of next week should prove an interesting event and it is to be hoped that everyone with an opinion will give it to the commissioners in order that it may help to influence legislation in the future.

#### Log Cutting Of Little Benefit To Country.

It is doubtful if the mere cutting of logs and exporting to the state of Washington or to Japan for manufacture is of much henefit to this country. We have the timber and in a few years it will be gone, if steps are not taken to conserve it. In the meantime others are benefiting at our expense. It seems the reasonable thing to require that all persons wishing to use our raw material shall do so in this country, especially a raw material so easily manufactured as is lumber. There are mills this country idle while the Washington state mills are busy on our material.
