

write the chemical equation for the growth reaction, as they now do for many other processes which occur in living cells, and which can be reproduced with chemicals in glass-ware.

The isolation of bios was a notable feat of analytical chemistry in itself. Some idea of its difficulty can be comprehended form the statement of the discoverer that from 400,000 parts of material only one part of "bios" is obtainable. In addition, it is extremely sensitive to exceedingly small variations in acidity. A slight understepping of the required acidity on one occasion, resulted in the loss of 70 per cent of the material.

Makes for Growth

When it is fed in amounts as small as one three millionth of the body weight, per day, young rats which had been declining, resumed their growth and showed a much improved condition in coat and general activity, beside! weight increase.

One of the hopeful features of the work on the structure of bios are the indications that it is probably a fairly simple substance. Analytical results, so far, show that it is not more complex than the simplest sugar. In the pure state, it has the form of spherical plates. 


