DEFENDS SYSTEM OF CADETS IN SCHOOL

Colonel Wells in Speech Urged All Round Development of the Boy

WINNIPEG, Feb. 9.—Replying to the toast of "The Cadet Services" Colonel G. A. Wells emphasized the fact that it was upon the youth of today that the world of tomorrow depended. He went on to say that the reaction from the war had brought with it two outstanding dangers to the well-being of the state, first, "the emphasis which we placed upon the importance of the youth, has led some of them to a grossly exaggerated opinion of themselves as they are, which has resulted in wide-spread lack of discipline and an utter disregard of law and order; secondly, in the hearts of many who have suffered seriously because of war there is a profound and reasonable hatred of anything which suggests war of any kind."

Depends on Directors

He went on to say that any organization which undertook to help in the training of youth, must keep these two facts in mind and tackle the problem carefully, "without offending those who did not see as we see." He thought this training could be found in the cadet movement. It stood for all round development of the boy, which would make him a useful citizen in peace and a useful soldier in time of war. The real value of the cadet movement depended entirely upon the type of men who led it. No amount of drill and parade could take the place of the personal influence of those in charge of the boys. There must be some change in the methods of cadet training, he said. "Too often the cadet

SCHOOL ESTIMATES IN VICTORIA ARE UP

Number of Pupils in that City Increased by Two Hundred

VICTORIA, Feb. 9.—Estimated expenditure for operation and maintenance of Victoria public schools during 1924, as compiled by the School Board, is slightly over \$19,000 greater than the amount expended during 1923, according to figures issued at the conclusion of the meeting.

This increase, it was explained, was made up principally by three items: Salaries of additional teachers, \$13,000, employment of whom was found necessary because the enrolment of pupils at the commencement of 1924 was some two hundred greater than at the beginning of January, 1923; capital expenditure of \$2,000 on the roof of the Boys' Central School; an increase of \$2,000 in the estimate for fuel; making a total of \$17,000. The remaining \$2,000 was made up of a number of necessary items, mostly repairs.

CANADIAN VOLUNTEER TRIP HERE CANCELLED

The Canadian Volunteer, which was to have come here on February 12 bringing freight and taking away ore, is not coming, her trip to this port having been cancelled. She has to dock at Vancouver and the freight for this port will be transferred to the regular steamer.

It has not yet been decided whether the ore will be shipped on one of the other boats or be allowed to accumulate until next month.
