OLIVER BACK FROM OTTAWA

Talks on Result of Conference at Capital on Railway Matters

VANCOUVER, Jan. 16.—Construction of a railway into Peace River from some point on the Canadian National Rly. east of Brule Lake will furnish the solution to the Peace River's long standing transportation problem, according to Premier Oliver, who returned today from Ottawa. He stated that he was somewhat disappointed with the railways attitude at Ottawa. "They proposed to put the cards on the whole question on the table but did not do so," he asserted. He had hoped to see the P.G.E. become a part of the system but that seemed impossible. Meanwhile there is nothing new regarding the disposal of the P.G.E.

PUT DEMOCRATS ON THEIR FEET

Franklin Roosevelt Making Efforts to Rehabilitate the Party

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—(By Canadian Press) — Domestic chiefs and politicians generally are stirred up over a movement to reorganize the democratic party and rehabilitate it in preparations for the 1926 congressional campaign and the presidential campaign of 1928. Franklin D. Roosevelt, who was candidate of the democrats for vice-president in 1920, has begun the movement and is sending out a communication to leading democrats for the purpose of exchanging views. This is expected to lead up to a national conference.

Importance of the movement lies in several phases of it. In the first place, Roosevelt is a Smith leader but he is enlisting Smith men, McAdoo chiefs, and democrats of various stripes, with the exception that the most radical democrats are being left out. For instance, it is said democrats of the type of Senator Wheeler who went out of the party in the recent campaign are not being encouraged.

If Roosevelt can succeed in his plan, the democratic party may get on its feet again and make a formidable showing two years hence. Democratic leaders insist they will then carry Congress.

Moreover, the movement is proceeding on the theory that the third party movement will either be dropped or will not become formidable.

In a practical way, it is proposed to put the finances of the democratic national committee on a sound basis; to energize the democratic national organization and have a year round campaign, especially in respect to publicity, speech making and the use of the radio; to have the national and state organizations constantly co-operate and watch closely over the special elections as they come up. It is not proposed to oust Democratic National Chairman Shaver, though this has been suggested.
