



VISIT PRINCE RUPERT

rying Legion of Honor For French Government

WINNIPEG, Mar. 4 .- On his way to Edmonton to carry out a special mission for the French government, Louis Frederick Rouquette, novelist and journalist of Paris, will arrive in Winnipeg tonight by Canadian National Railways, it was announced last evening.

Mr. Rouquette has been commissioned by Baron de Vitrolles, Consul General for France, acting on instructions received from Premier Herriot, to present to His Grace, Bishop Grouard, Apostolic vicar of Athabasca, the Cross of the Legion of Honor which was awarded him some time ago.

Mr. Rouguette, who is himself a Knight of the Order, will preside at the official presentation and give the "Accolade" to the knight. Robert George Brett, M.D., Lieut.-Governor of Alberta, has been invited by the Consul General of France to attend the ceremony with members of his staff.

This will be the third time Mr.

Rouquette has visited Canada. In 1915 he crossed the continent and in 1916 he went to Alaska where he spent eighteen months.
