New Envoy to Lisbon 'Walking Advertisement'

VANCOUVER (CP)—A walking advertisement for Canada has gone to Lisbon as the new Canadian commercial councillor in the Portuguese capital.

Col. Lawrence Moore Cosgrave, former gunnery officer, served overseas in the First World War and since 1922 has worked for the Department of Trade and Commerce in many places, chiefly in the Far East.

For the last three years he has resided here as a foreign trade councillor, and his new appointment takes him to Eu-

rope for the first time since 1924 when he was the Canadian government trade commissioner at the Wembley Exhibition in England.

Of his enforced absences from Canada he said here: "You go into the service with the idea of serving Canada, and when you've done that you can retire with the feeling you've done your bit to help the country you love most."

MAGNIFICENT BLOOPER

As Canadian military commissioner in the southwest Pacific

during the Second World War, Col. Cosgrave signed the Japanese surrender for Canada—and thereby hangs a tale.

Each delegate signed two copies of the surrender document—one for Japan and one for the United Nations. The signature was to go on a line provided above the name of the signer's country. Col. Cosgrave somehow lapsed and signed underneath instead of above.

The next three delegates carried the error through as their turns came to sign. When the document was delivered by an aide to Mamour Shigemitsu, the Japanese foreign minister, the Japanese noticed the error and called attention to it. After considerable discussion, Lt.-Gen. Walter Sutherland, Gen. Douglas MacArthur's chief of staff, leaned over the table and laboriously ran two strokes of his fountain pen through the names of the four countries above the misplaced signatures. Gravely, he wrote the countries in below and, still more gravely, the Japanese accepted the corrected document and peace became an official reality.

Previous to his stint as military commissioner, Col. Cosgrave was appointed trade commissioner to Shanghai, where he also served as group commander of the international volunteer corps which kept order there.

SHREWD DEAL

Always keeping an eye open for Canada's interests, he once managed to sell some Canadian railway ties to a Chinese business man he was taking to a police station for questioning. Referring to his new position, he said in an interview here: "Portugal is the oldest ally the Commonwealth has, and I think the peninsula is going to be important in the years ahead."

"I'll be keeping my eye on Gibraltar, Spanish Morocco and Algiers and the Mediterranean area generally."

He'll also be keeping an eye on his first love—Canada, particularly British Columbia.

IT PAYS TO ADVERTISE

Tall Men from Arkansas Invade North for Fishing

Eight big men, including a mayor from California and a lieutenant-governor from Arkansas, "invaded" Prince Rupert on Thursday.

Enroute home from a fishing trip to Juneau, the group arrived here shortly after noon on the luxurious 130-foot yacht Brodie, owned by Henry F. Haldeman of Los Angeles.

Two of the group, Marsh Johnson of Reno, Nevada, and E. C. (Cap) Barwick of Memphis, Tennessee, paid a brief visit to the Rotary Club luncheon bringing greetings from their cities.

Mr. Johnson, a six-foot six-inch automobile agent in Reno described his city as the "biggest civilian separation centre in the world."

Later as he strolled along Third Avenue carrying his coat while a light drizzle of rain fell, he said, "if we could only get some of this in Reno we'd have the most marvelous city in America."

Mr. Johnson, Burch Greene, Clem Atwater and Jim White, all of Los Angeles, left here by CPA

late Thursday for Vancouver where they were scheduled to board another plane enroute to Los Angeles.

Raymond Grey, mayor of Tall, California, and owner of a retail lumber yard there and Mr. Haldeman left by train for Banff and Lake Louise.

Mr. Barwick and Burch Jennings, lieutenant-governor of Arkansas, who lives in Little Rock, left aboard the Prince Rupert to visit Vancouver and Victoria before going home.

TALL MEN

With the exception of Mayor Grey, all the men are auto dealers and all are at least six feet tall.

They flew up to Alaska and Mr. Haldeman had his yacht brought up by the crew of eight. The crew is remaining in port here for a few days before sailing for California.

The group left Juneau two weeks ago and, said Mr. Johnson, "on the way south we went into every bay and place we could to fish and have fun."

SCREEN ★ FLASHES

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—After nearly breaking her leg on one, you'd think Rosalind Russell would lose her enthusiasm for movie locations. But not Ros.

"I'm simply wild about locations," said the actress. "Why, do you know that in 39 pictures I had never been on location before? Pictures are so much more real when they're filmed in the actual place of the story. It's stimulating to the actors."

Miss Russell shows remarkable perseverance. She just returned from locating with "Never Wave at a Wac" at Camp Lee, Va., training centre of the Women's Army Corps.

HOT DRILL
"When we first got there, the girls in the cast went through the drill," Miss Russell related. "The heat was over 100 degrees but we drilled six hours a day for three days. We didn't mind it at all, until we discovered we were using muscles we had never used before."

In one scene, she took a tumble, and it was feared that she had broken her leg. Tests proved otherwise, but she has a large wound that will leave a permanent scar.

The WAC picture is part of Miss Russell's determined campaign to escape being typed as a professional woman.

"I've been an executive, lawyer, doctor, psychiatrist, judge, advertising woman, newspaper gal, etc. How long could I go on shouting into telephones?"

STAGE COMEBACK

Her determination to shake such roles was part of the reason she undertook her first return to the stage in 15 years. She toured in 11 cities for six months with "Bell, Book and Candle." She admitted that director-author Josh Logan talked her into it.
