## Urges Development of Railway and Port and Defends Elevator Here

President of Board of Trade writes to Ottawa Journal setting forth Industrial Position and Kefuting Fallacies

The president of the Board of Trade, G. W. Nickerson, has sent the following letter to the Ottawa Journal in answer to criticisms of the elevator expenditure here:

After reading the arguments advanced by those sponsoring the vote for the Prince Rupert elevator, I am not surprised at the abundance of criticism raised in the House, and by the press. Failure on the part of those who should have furnished the information prompts me to offer, through the courtesy of your paper, some facts which I believe justify it's construction.
