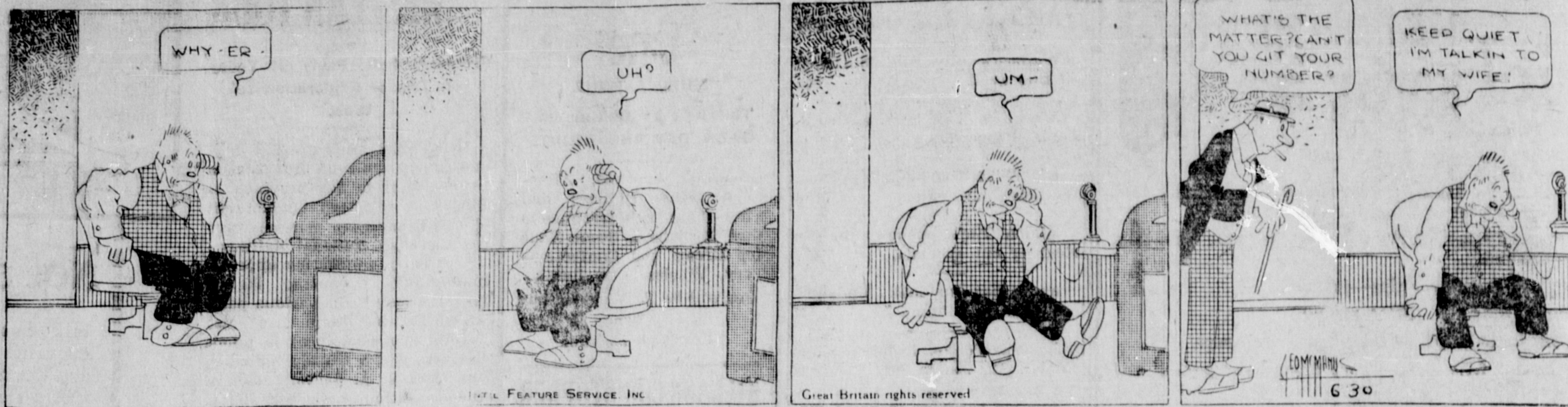

RUSHING SILK TO NEW YORK

Canadian National Making First Shipment of Valuable Cargo From Orient.

WINNIPEG, July 6.—Making what is believed to constitute a record run for the distance between Vancouver and Winnipeg, a special silk train comprising 2,300 packages of silk from Vancouver to New York passed through Winnipeg at noon Friday, just 37 and a-half hours after leaving Vancouver. Canadian National officials cite this as a record in rapid transit of this commodity which is of such value that every minute consumed in transit counts.

Story of Texas Trail and of Girl Who Led Big Cattle Drive Northward.

It is of the Texas trail that Emerson Hough writes and he has made from it a true epic of the pioneers.

He pictures a country wild, almost lawless and moreover just then ravaged and disheathered by the recent Civil War.

With an amazing, prodigious effort the Texas cattlemen were seeking their market all the way to Kansas, where the railroads from the east were reaching.

In a glorious production Irvin Willat depicts what came about when Taisie Lockhart, owner and manager of her own vast ranch in the Lone Star state, found herself no better than a dead broke heiress, with no means of disposing of her herds.

But Taisie possessed the true spirit of the pioneers. Word came that way up 'North of 36' a market beckoned. With her 4,500 cows, 16 cow hands, 19 kinds of rifles and six-shooters and 115 saddle ponies, Taisie made the start—with all the terrors of the wild, uncharted way ahead.

It is with this desperate adventure that 'North of 36' deals. And through this great panorama one sees the group of ragged, snowey men, the glorious girl at their head, the ox carts and the sea of long-horn cattle, accomplishing one of the greatest deeds of pioneer bravery and daring.
