

French Catholic Party off Today on Trip of Exploration to

MONTREAL, July 6 .- The second annual tour of the Liason Francaise from the province of Quebec to Western Canada left Montreal Saturday morning over the Canadian National Railways.

The party, numbering approximately 120, comprised largely parish priests from various parts of Quebec, but there are also several men prominent in public life in Eastern Canada including the Hon. M. A. Sauve, leader of the opposition in Quebec and L. Brown of the Quebec department of agriculture.

The trip is under the direction of the Rev. Father J. A. Ouellette. director of the Federal Bureau of 158 Colonization Missionaries, by which it was organized.

Two Fold Purpose

The tour has a two fold purpose, one of these is to carry a message from the French Canadians of Quebec to those who have left this province to settle in Western Canada. The second is to allow parish priests to see the agricultural districts of the West for themselves so that they will be better able to give information to those of their parishioners who frequently appeal to them for advice when they are contemplating migrating to other parts of Canada.

Quebec City will be the first! stop. There an official representation will be tendered the party by the government and they will have an audience with Cardinal Begin from Quebec and the party will continue west, stopping at] other points en route to Winnipeg, which will be reached on
