Captain Hocking has exhibited these pictures in different parts and the views of Prince Rupert have undoubtedly served to advertise this city in a very unique and impressive manner.


SPRINGTIME BRINGS ITS SPRING CLEANING



TOUGH CURRENCY FOR GREENLAND

Far Northern Country Will Soon Have Coinage of its Own

COPENHAGEN, May 8.—Greenland, which hitherto has used the coinage of her mother country, Denmark, is shortly to have a coinage of her own. The coins will carry on one side the figure of a polar bear. The bills will be on especially strong paper to withstand the rough handling they will receive in circulation through the Eskimo colonies.
