The Canadian halibut schooner Livingstone, Capt. A. Martinsen, was taken up yesterday and will have a new keel, shaft log and stern post put in.


The Inverness cannery tender Florence is coming in for general overhaul as is also the Canadian halibut schooner Prosperity A.
