## SPEEDY PLANES BRING BOMBAY NEARER LONDON

Machines Being Built With 2,000 Horsepower Engines to Make 100 Miles an Hour.

LONDON, July 8. — All steel airplanes now under construction here will make the trip from England to India, roughly 8,000 miles as the crow would fly, if he were able to accomplish it, in three days and some odd hours, according to recent announcement of the air ministry under whose supervision the machines are being built.

The specifications provide that the planes be equipped with three motors developing 2,000 horsepower, and it is hoped they will be able to accomplish 100 miles an hour and possibly even a greater speed. A crew of four or five will operate each machine, which will carry 20 to 25 passengers. It is proposed that these giants of the air travel day and night, there being sleeping accommodations, and hot meals by means of an electric cooker.

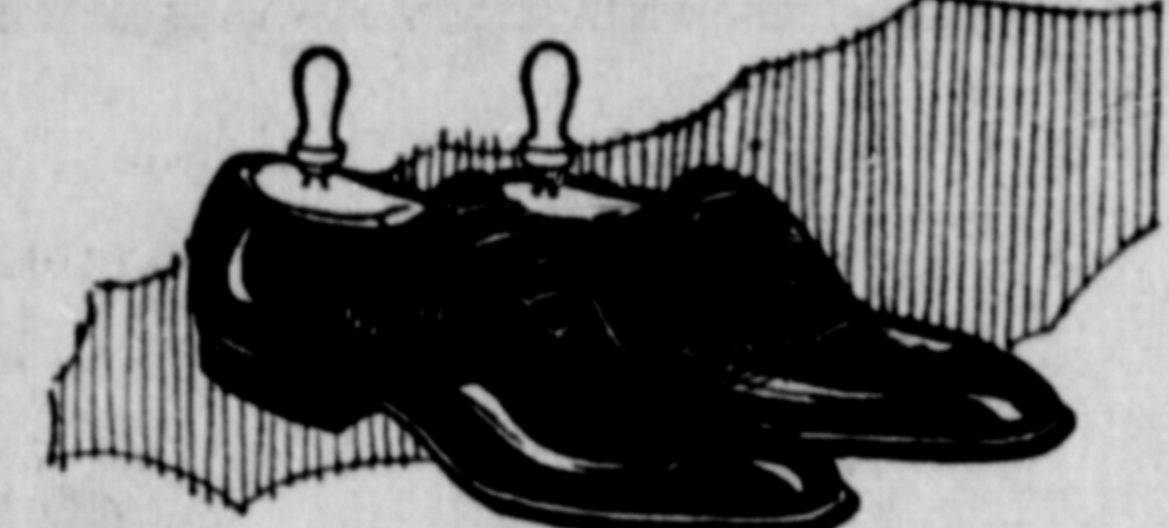

LONDON, July 7.—To encourage the growing of flax seed and flax in the United Kingdom on a commercial scale, a committee appointed by the Board of Trade has unanimously recommended that \$200,000 be made available. ## DROUGHT AND WINDS DAMAGE GRAIN CROPS IN SOUTHERN ALBERTA

Big Crop in Adjacent Province But Not So Large As Exaggerated Reports Say.

EDMONTON, July 8.—Dry weather and hot winds have been responsible for cutting down some of the bright crop prospects in portions of southern Alberta, according to Hon. George Hoadley, minister of agriculture, who returned from the district east of Calgary. There is no doubt, says the minister, that these conditions have made a reduction of several bushels per acre in the likely yield, and allowance must be made accordingly.

The minister also points out that published but unofficial estimates of the crop have been considerably exaggerated. In making up these estimates the fact has been overlooked that there is a substantial decrease in acreage through the removal of 900 farmers from the south country to other parts of the province and the abandonment of their holdings as crop-producing farms. Much reseeded has been done also, because of damage by cutworms, and such reseeded areas must be taken out of the wheat column.

For reasons such as these, says Mr. Hoadley, the acreage in wheat crop, even allowing for increases in some cases, will probably not exceed 5,500,000 acres. If the yield per acre proves to be as good as in 1923, when twenty-eight bushels was the point reached, there will be a total harvest of about 154,000,000 bushels. Some of the estimates have greatly exceeded this, but they have been, it is pointed out, on wrong figures as to acreage.

"Even at that it will be a wonderful crop," remarked the minister of agriculture, and it spells a great measure of prosperity for Alberta. There is no justification, however, for extreme and exaggerated reports about the likely yield, which do not take the facts sufficiently into account. It is a fact that in the dry districts there is a material reduction in acreage and that, moreover, the heat and winds of a few days ago have done serious harm to the growing grain.

## CENSORS KILL POLITICAL NEWS

Brazilian Editors Said To Take Too Great Advantage of Freedom.

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil, July 8.—A staff of censors has been distributed among the local newspapers by the Brazilian government in order to prevent the publication of attacks on President Arthur Bernardes and the Brazilian government. An unofficial statement secured at the foreign office explained the move as a guarantee for public order. "The public at present is an easy prey to newspaper propaganda," it was explained, "and some Brazilian editors take unjustifiable advantage of the freedom of the press. If the newspapers were not restrained, their contents would create a bad impression about Brazil when read abroad."

Editors say that most of the cutting is in copy dealing with administration policies and revolutionary plotting.

The government's power to stop publication of an unfriendly newspaper was checked recently by Octavio Kelly, a judge of the federal courts in Rio de Janeiro, who made a decision which permits the reappearance of the Correio da Manhã, after a ban of nine months. The newspaper was closed last year shortly after the revolutionists were driven out of the city of Sao Paulo, and many of the editorial staff have been in jail. The owner and editor, Edmundo Bittencourt, escaped after seven months and is now a political refugee at the Chilean embassy. His son, part owner and managing editor, has been confined for nearly one year.

### Property Rights.

The decision of Judge Kelly was based on the opinion that the closing of a newspaper by the government is a violation of the private property rights guaranteed citizens of Brazil by the constitution. Mr. Bittencourt claims to have lost \$200,000 as a result of the ban against his newspaper.

The city editor of O Jornal, an important commercial paper of Rio de Janeiro, was arrested a few days ago, the day after the censor stopped the appearance of a story dealing with one of the candidates for the forth coming presidential election.
