If the cutoff to Obed or Brule is built, no other is likely to follow for many years. And the Obed route will not serve a very large country or be very much advantage to the country it taps. To come out by the westerly route would be a permanent solution of the transportation problems of the district and would mean the building of a trunk line rather than a branch.
