Rich Strike of Ore in Marmot River Mine is Financing Operations

STEWART, June 17 .- A strike, equalled only in mining operations in this camp by the Premier, has occurred on the Porter-Idaho on Marmot River in a winze being sunk from the lower tunnel on a lenze of ore which last year yielded a gross smeller return of \$205 per ton. This winze is down 60 feet and gives an average width of 12 inches of this high grade ore on the wall of a vein carrying a good grade of milling ore.

It is stated that the intention of the management is to drift both ways from the bottom of the winze and stope the high grade for immediate ship-

ment. A safe estimate of the weight of this ore is seven cubic feet to the ton. More than 50 HEROIC RESCUE tons are already sorted and on the dump awaiting the pack train for shipment. It will commence moving down the hill on Monday, June 20.
