## MAY ESTABLISH ZIONIST CENTRE

Charles F. Caldwell Announces It  
Will be Located in Kootenay  
Lake District

VANCOUVER, May 11.—A new Zionist centre into which anyone who agrees to abide by the Ten Commandments and leave drink and tobacco alone may enter will shortly be established at the mouth of the Lardeau River in British Columbia, according to Charles F. Caldwell, general overseer and successor to Alexander Dowie, of Zion City, Ill. The proposed name of the new community is "Shiloh City."

"Shiloh City will be governed on the same lines as Zion City," said Mr. Caldwell, who has taken up the question of acquiring the land tract with the provincial government. He is looking into the prospects of marketing timber off the land for lumber and pulpwood as he expects that timber products will be one of the principal sources of revenue for the colony.

Mr. Caldwell estimates that there is land enough embraced in his proposition for a community of 50,000 persons. The land will be sold to the settlers on long terms. The land in Zion City was sold under an ar-

## DRY WEATHER IN INTERIOR

### Conditions for Farming Auspicious—Forest Fire Menace

The continued dry weather of the past few weeks has caused the danger season for forest fires to open earlier than usual and the Forestry Service officials have had to take steps to check a couple in this vicinity already.

Ranger Sid Cooper left town a couple of days ago with a crew of ten men to cope with a fire that is burning about 11 miles from here on the south fork of Canyon Creek.

There is also a fire in the same vicinity but a few miles nearer town that has spread from the burning of the tie slash and is now giving trouble.

The weather has been ideal for the farmers, however, and the spring work is well advanced in comparison with other years. Although there has only been one good rain this spring there is considerable more moisture in the ground than at this time last year which gives a bright outlook of the timothy crop.

## FIRST MOTOR TRIP FROM BURNS LAKE TO SMITHERS MADE

SMITHERS, May 11.—The first car of the season to make the trip from Burns Lake to Smithers arrived here Saturday evening driven by P. Brunnell with John Yool, manager of the Royal Bank in that town as a passenger. They report the road to be in very good condition for this time of year although they had a little trouble caused by the high water in the creeks that cross the road. The hot weather of the last few days has caused the water to rise to the flooding point in the creeks and rivers and in some instances the bridges or culverts have been washed out.
