Local Manslaughter Case to Start Tomorrow - Judge Gives Detailed Charge

A. Macdonald went at some detail into the law covering manslaughter arising from automobile accidents.

This was not manslaughter in the ordinary way, His Lordship stated. Negligence was the basis of such charges. It was the duty and legal responsibility "of persons in charge of dangerous things" such as automobiles to exercise reasonable precaution and care in the protection of human life. The law held any person who failed to do this criminally responsible and that person might be found guilty of manslaughter. 
