Tribe, Yanks Both Meet Defeat in Pennant Race

 NEW YORK.—Cleveland Indians failed to gain on New York Yankees in the American League pennant race last night, dropping an 11-8 decision to Detroit Tigers while Yanks were humbled 3-0 by Philadelphia Athletics.

Rookie Harry Byrd pitched a one-hitter to blank the league leaders and Athletics defeated their Nemesis, Vic Raschi, for the first time in more than two years.

A "bloop" hit by Irv Noren that dropped just inside the left field line for a double in the second inning thwarted Byrd's effort for a no-hitter.

Results left second-place Cleveland 3½ games behind the Yankees. Athletics grouped four hits for all of their runs in the sixth, aided by a wild pitch and an error by Mickey Mantle.

Don Killoway's pinch homer with bases loaded in the sixth inning sewed up the victory for last-place Detroit.

 Brooklyn Dodgers and New York Giants both won their games in the National League, leaving the Giants eight games behind the front-running Dodgers.

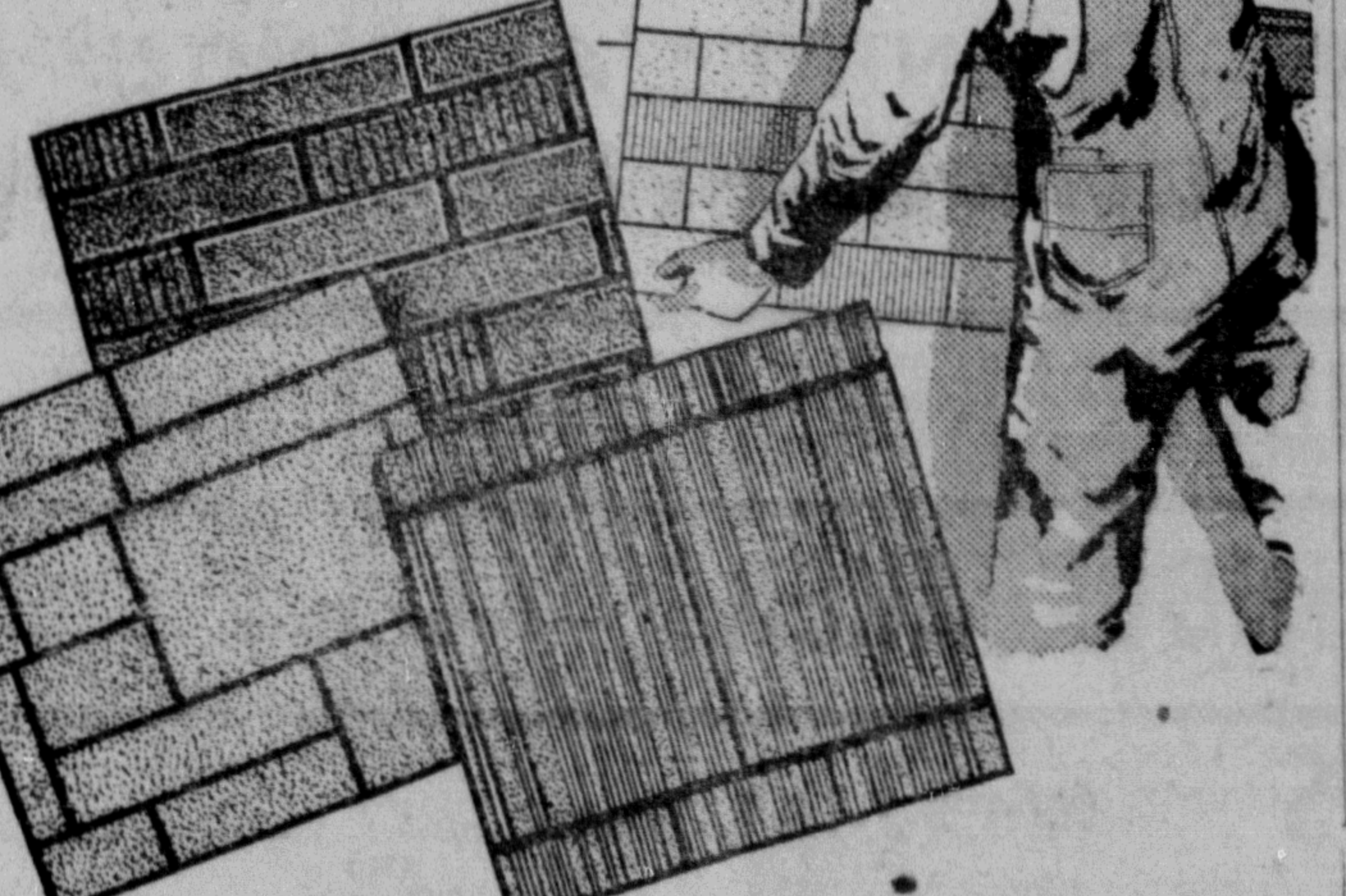

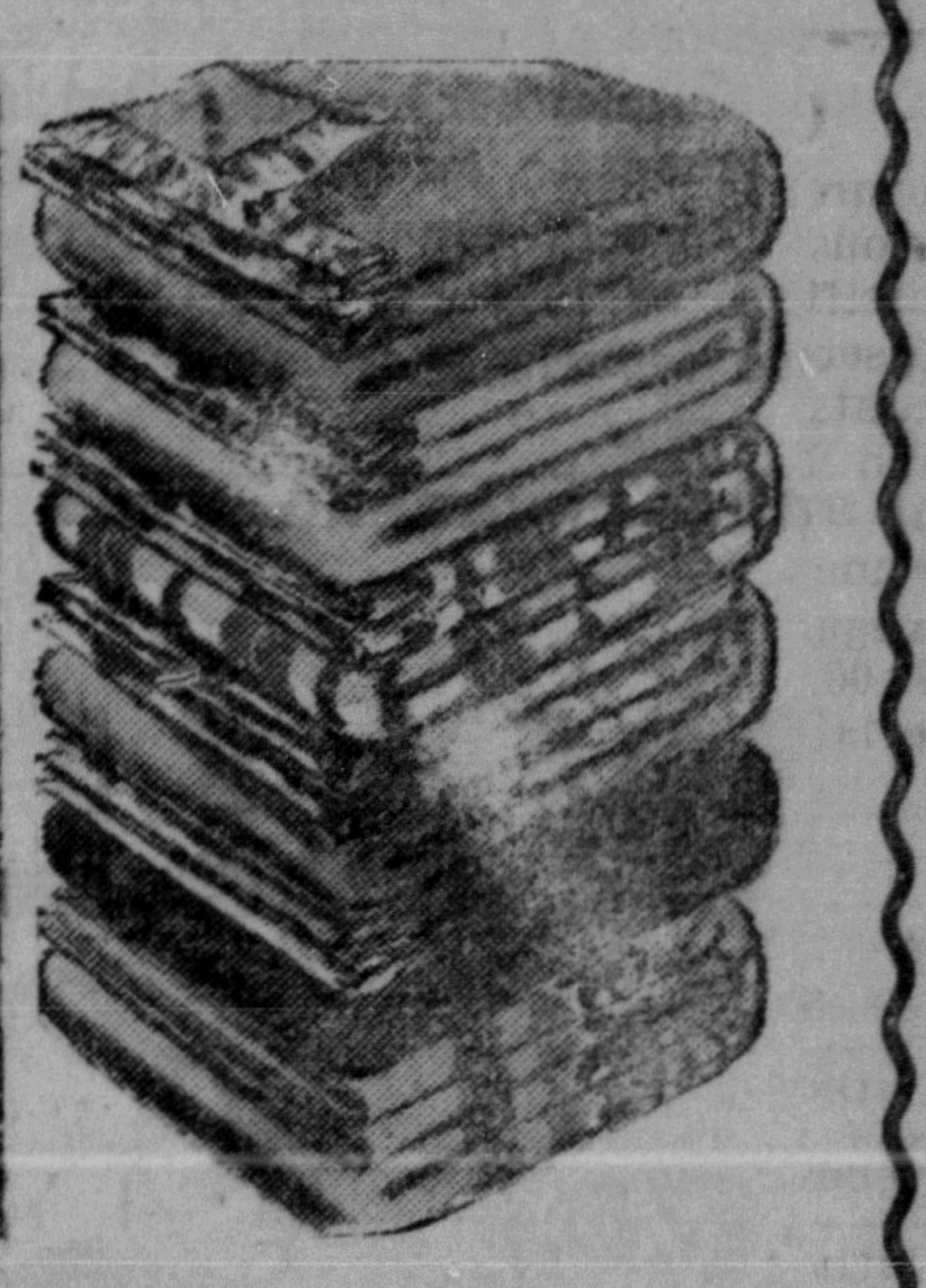
