KENTUCKY TO STOP GOSSIPING TONGUES

Invokes Law to Prevent Malicious Wagging and Fines Imposed

FRANKFORT, Ky., Feb. 11. — With the announced purpose of curbing the malicious wagging of tongues, the Kentucky anti-gossip law is being invoked and is securing convictions.

Frowning upon the repeating or scattering of false rumors or reports of a slanderous or harmful nature, it places a \$10 to \$100 fine or 10 to 50 days' imprisonment, or both, as punishment.

The gossip is deemed guilty unless he is able to show to the satisfaction of a judge or jury that he carefully investigated the source and foundation of the handed remarks, and proved that they had reasonable grounds.
