ges that should be made in the rules of Congress is, of course, a problem for the Congress itself—as president, I could not make the decision."  
Lodge promptly accused Stevenson of a "pious, insincere piece of double-talk," noting that Democrats had controlled the Senate for four years.  
Lodge now is ranking Republican in the Senate rules committee and a candidate for reelection. If he wins and Republicans get control of the Senate, Lodge said that as rules chairman:  
"I will fight filibusters as long as it takes to end filibusters. It never has been done and I am the boy who wants to do it."  
Veterans agree that as few as eight Senators could conduct a permanent filibuster that would prevent action on any legislation.

## Baltic Sea Stones Decorate Costumes

TORONTO (CP)—Amber pebbles and stones from the shores of the Baltic form the centre of attraction in the Lithuanian booth at the Canadian National Exhibition here.

Mrs. Aldona Veselkiene, booth attendant, who came to Canada five years ago, says a pair of these stones from her native Lithuania form an almost essential part of the country's national costume.

And costumes are important in Lithuania, where each province has its own symbols. No two costumes are alike and Mrs. Veselkiene says there is plenty of room for imagination. It is estimated there are 25,000 immigrants of Lithuanian descent in Canada, including many who escaped from the Communist regime which has spread over Lithuania and the other Baltic states.

## Professor Talks To Credit Club

Professor Laurence Vukelich, Extension Department, University of British Columbia, opened his breakfast chat with a compliment to the Credit Women's Breakfast Club of Prince Rupert. He complimented not only their efforts in getting up for this early morning meeting, but also for their efforts in self-improvement.

In his sincere, inspiring manner, he spoke of the great future that lies in the retail credit world. At the time that credit held no importance, women took on the job of establishing and running the credit departments. By the time retail credit was recognized as being the most important part of a store, and not something delegated to under the stairs, women were firmly established in this field.

"Retail credit is no longer the smallest department of a store, it is now the most important, the key department of any store," he said. "Women are peculiarly adapted to this sort of work. They have the natural facilities for educating the public to the many types of retail credit, for building customer goodwill in a tactful and humane manner. "No longer is credit to be shunned. It is now the biggest part of the nation's business and as such offers to women an unlimited field of opportunity."

Lorraine Dell of Frizzell Motors received the birthday bouquet for the month, and Beatrice Dumas of Lyons Grocery, won the raffle prize.

A report of the recent rummage sale was given by President Jocelyn. It was a success and will be held annually.

President Jocelyn presented Professor Vukelich with a framed picture of Prince Rupert. Mary Simpson, Rupert Motors, supplied the picture, and Diane Kennedy of Northern B.C. Power Co., did the framing.

## Early Settlers Had Lively Time On Celebrations

GUELPH, Ont. (CP)—The jubilant celebrations and hard work surrounding the founding of this city in 1827 are described in a 75-year-old booklet that has just come to light.

Author Robert Thompson says in the booklet he was a 10-year-old resident of Galt, about 12 miles south of here, when on April 22, 1827, a party which included John Galt headed here. Wagons were loaded with pork, flour, whisky and other "necessary supplies."

Galt, at that time, was a "place of about 70 or 80 inhabitants, with one store, a tavern, grist and saw mill, a distillery and 10 houses."

The trip to Guelph took nine hours. Here the party slept in a log shanty, erected earlier by surveyors, and under wagons and wigwams.

The following day a giant maple was felled and surveyor John McDonald placed his compass on the stump and declared it the centre of the proposed city.
