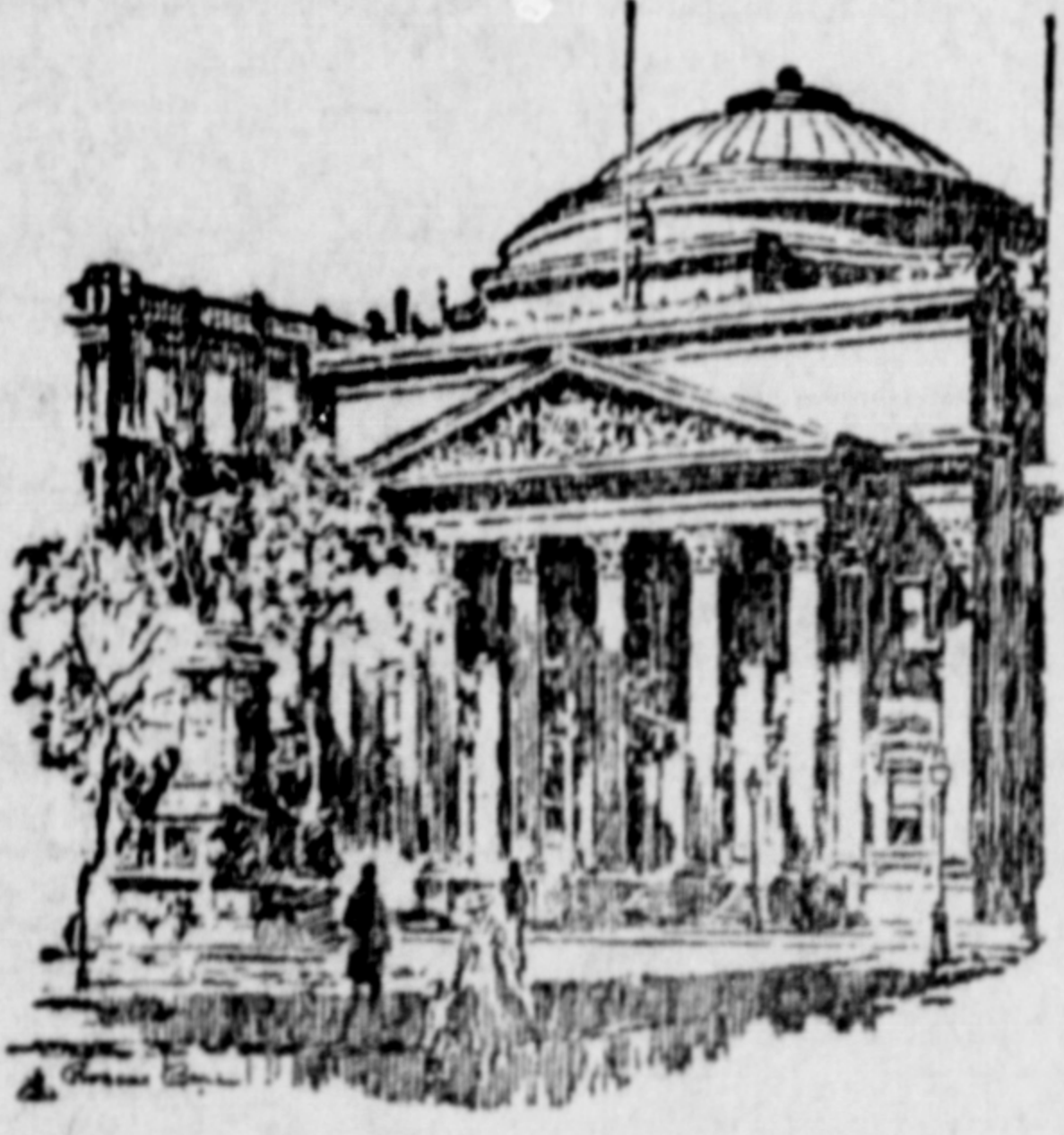


Let Your Banker Collect It

ANOTHER LOG BARGE COMING

If New Type of Craft Succeed, Davis Rafts Will be Thing of Past

Davis rafts may soon be a thing of the past as far as the transportation of logs across the stormy Hecla Straits from the Queen Charlotte Islands to the mainland is concerned if the big log carrying barges prove successful.

The British Pacific Transport Co.'s barge Binghamon has already made one voyage from Cumshewa Inlet with a big load of logs. Next fall there will be another similar barge in operation. It will be the former sailing ship Helwig Vinnen recently purchased in San Francisco by Capt. Barney Johnson for the Hecla Straits Towing Co.

The Helwig Vinnen arrived at Vancouver from San Francisco this week and, after a complete refitting for her new work, it is expected she will be ready to make her first trip to the Islands next fall. Capt. Johnson proposes to change her name to "Oyster."

The Helwig Vinnen was built and launched at Leith, Scotland, in 1891 and her first name was Greenock. This was changed to Persimmon and again to her present name when she went into German hands. During the Great War, the vessel was interned at San Francisco and has been there since. She has a carrying capacity of 5,000 tons deadweight and will have three big open holds. Like the Binghamon, she will be equipped with a large travelling crane operated by a donkey engine.

STEWART MINER LOST ON TRAIL TO MINE

STEWART, Jan. 23. — Louis Gold Thorpe, a packer and miner, is believed to have been lost on the trail between here and the United Empire mine. He left Stewart nine days ago.

Ray Warlock of the firm of F. G. Dawson, Ltd. arrived this morning, having come by way of Jasper from Vancouver and worked the towns in the interest of his firm on the way here. About a week ago he fell on the ice and broke a couple of ribs but is still working. He will be in town about a week.

RADIONS HEAR ABOUT ECLIPSE

Lecture Given Last Night on Tomorrow Morning's Solar Event

WINNIPEG, Jan. 23. — Stressing the importance of warnings which had previously been issued on that particular phase of the subject, R. Meldrum Stewart, director of the Dominion Observatory, Ottawa, repeated the admonition that all persons intending to watch the eclipse of the sun, which is to take place tomorrow morning, should provide themselves beforehand with smoked or colored glasses to protect their eyes from the direct glare of the sun, adding that a fogged photographic plate will serve almost equally as well.

The director of the observatory gave on the C.N.R. radio a summary of the events preceding the eclipse and told listeners—in just what to look for as the moon comes between sun and earth, shutting off the light of the former, and in this connection Mr. Stewart recorded that in the past such events were looked upon with superstition as heralding disaster or pestilence.

Mr. Stewart said that among other points to be scientifically investigated tomorrow are the effects of the cutting off of the sun's radiation on the amount and direction of the earth's magnetic force which connect the action of the compass, and of the many peculiarities attending the reception of wireless signals with the curious vagaries so often observed.
