

Strikers Looted Stores Glace Bay Mines when in Conflict with Police

Several Fires Reported on Property of Company; Troops Rushed to District; **Power House Wrecked**

SYDNEY, N.S., June 12.- Several thousand miners, who are on strike in the Glace Bay district, are reported this morning to have looted the stores of the British Empire Steel Corporation in the vicinity of New Waterford where the battle took place yesterday between police and miners, which resulted in the death of William Davis, 35 years of age, a miner, who was shot dead when the miners rushed the police and dangerously wounded Gilbert Watson, who was shot in the abdomen and when two score police and miners were injured.
