



Claims of Indians to Lands of Province are Disputed by Charles Harrison in Article

(By C. Harrison)

When I first came to the Queen Charlotte Islands, the Indians only valued their fishing streams and hunting grounds and, even in regard to these, they oftentimes quarrelled among themselves. These difficulties continually existed among them and, on January 15, 1898, I received the following authority from one of the officials of the Indian Department:

"I do hereby depute and authorize you to hear and determine in a legal and just manner any and all disputes arising

Spoil Two Irish Beauty
