WILL ATTEMPT WORLD FLIGHT

Major de Pinedo, Italian Chief of Air Staff, Will Hop Off From Rome in May

ROME, March 5.—Major de Pinedo, Chief of the Air Staff, plans to hop off next May from Rome on a flight around the world, which will cover 35,625 miles, the way his route is planned.

The route he follows will include Athens, Egypt, the Red Sea, the southern coast of Asia, Tokyo, the Pacific Archipelago and Sydney, Australia. His route from that point has yet to be arranged. This is an entirely new route, and will be of even more interest than former round-the-world flights, as there are some long jumps on the route from Tokyo to Sydney, Australia.

The Chief of the Air Staff will be accompanied by a mechanic as yet unnamed, and the machine to be used will be a 400-hour power machine, with a flight capacity of ten hours.
