ONTARIO METHODISTS ARE BEING AROUSED

Properties Valued at \$35,000,000 are involved in Proposed Legislation

TORONTO, Mar. 6.—Possible effects of Church Union legislation in Ontario on property holdings of the Methodist Church are beginning to arouse Methodist concern.

Methodism has in this Province 1890 churches, 763 parsonages, 487 cemeteries, four colleges, its main publishing plant, and numerous missionary and deaconess institutions, all of which would be affected by the bill now sponsored in the Ontario Legislature by the opponents of Church Union. The total valuation of these properties is nearly \$35,000,000.

At the last session of the Provincial Legislature the Church Union forces introduced their own bill, but opponents attached to it amendments which would have touched very closely the vital interests of the Congregationalist and Methodist churches as well as of the Presbyterian Church. The bill was accordingly withdrawn by its sponsors on the request of the responsible spokesmen of the three churches Now two new bills are before the legislature.

AIDS FOREIGN TEACHERS

TOKIO, March 6 .- The educational department proposes to introduce a bill in the present session of the diet to provide houses for the foreign teachers in the government schools. There are nearly 100 such instructors, largely American and British, and about \$150,000 will be asked for the housing scheme.

EARNINGS DECREASE

MONTREAL, Mar. 6. - The gross earnings of the Canadian National Railways from January to February 21, 1925, have been \$29,016,001, being a decrease of \$2,220,369 over the corresponding period of 1924.
