Meets With Some Success In Getting Money for Hospital PROTESTS RECEIVED

Whatever criticisms there may be and there seem to be many regarding the action taken by the hospital hoard in having obtained the services of the National Protective Agency working out of Los Angeles to collect outstanding hospital accounts, a measure of success seems to be obtaining! at least as far as actual collections are concerned. People, who it seems it was impossible to obtain any response from otherwise, are now being heard from DAUGHTERS AND SONS and, in a number of eases, there have been prompt payments. The National Protective Agency seems to be an unpopular institution but, nevertheless, and effective one.

Piper, which has been published, was read.
