MORE SETTLERS FOR CANADA

Many Arriving This Week on all Liners From Europe and Coming West

WINNIPEG, April 30. — The advance guard of more large parties of immigrants due in Winnipeg during the next week will arrive tonight when passengers from the White Star liner "Arabic," Hamburg, will reach the city in special cars attached to the Continental Limited. Of the 300 passengers destined for Canadian points, 250 are third class, including a special group of farm laborers coming to Canada under the auspices of the department of colonization, agriculture and natural resources of the Canadian National Railways and destined for points in the prairie provinces.

Other parties due at Halifax during the next few days from the S.S. Drottinholm, Swedish American line; Veendam, Holland-American line; Zealand, Red Star line; and Hellig-Olav, Scandinavian-American line; giving a total of 643 passengers, who will move westward over the Canadian National. From now on the majority of settlers arriving for Canada will disembark

at Quebec and a large amount of equipment has been forwarded to that point by the C.N. system to take care of the movements from there at the week end. The LeLidra, Anchor-Donaldson line; Regina, White Star line; and the Antonia, Cunard line, are due with 2,754 cabin and third class passengers.

The Letitia carries a special party directed by the C.N.R. numbering 143 persons, the majority of whom are coming west. There is also a Salvation Army party of 71 and an Ontario government group. The Letitia also carries a number of families who are to settle down under the provisions of the Overseas Settlement Act.

The Regina carries a large party of British settlers, including a group of families who are to take up farms under the Settlement Act.

HAIG CANNOT COME TO THIS PROVINCE

Expresses Regrets in Answer to Premier Oliver's Invitation

VICTORIA, April 30. — Field Marshal Haig, commander of the British forces during the war, will not be able this summer to make the British Columbia visit to which Premier Oliver invited him recently.

He cabled his reply to the premier's invitation, saying that he appreciated the kind invitation, but that the time available in Canada would not permit of his acceptance. He is coming to attend a veterans' convention at Ottawa.

STATE OF MICHIGAN IS AFTER PART CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAY SYSTEM AND THIS IS RESISTED BY THORNTON.

"Labor" declares that the state of Michigan will not operate the branch but will hand it over to some United States railroad at a handsome profit. The paper says, in part:—

Right to Buy

"Under the charter granted the road many years ago the state of Michigan, it is claimed by the supporters of the resolution has the right to buy the property for the amount of the actual investment, which is said to be only a little more than half its market value.

"It is not proposed that the state shall retain the road. The advocates of the resolution frankly declare that the state can easily dispose of the property to some American transportation system at a profit of \$10,000,000.

"The supporters of this extraordinary proposal argue that the state would be justified in forcing the purchase because under the road's special charter the state has been helpless in its efforts to make the Grand Trunk perform needed work of improvement and service or pay a just tax.

"It is not contended that the Canadian National, since it came into possession of the Grand Trunk, has violated its charter. In fact, the courts of the state have held that the road was complying with the provisions of its charter."

Rival Road Suspected

"The supporters of the resolution, however, hold that the charter itself is unjust to the people of Michigan and should be wiped out through the purchase of the road by the state.

"There is reason to believe that the scheme to purchase the road was suggested to the politicians who are in control of the state government of Michigan by the Pennsylvania, or some other trunk line, which desired to get control of the D., G. H. and M. because of its importance as a connecting link.

"At the same time, by taking the road away from the Canadian National, that great experiment in government ownership can be seriously crippled."

"Labor" declares that "in order that the Canadian National might get its side of the story before the people," it wired Sir Henry Thornton and publishes the following as a "signed statement" received from the Canadian National's president in reply:

"The Detroit, Grand Haven and Milwaukee is an integral part of the Grand Trunk Western Railway System which became a part of the Canadian National Railways when the latter system was formed.

Cost Twenty-Five Millions

"The Canadian National Railway and its predecessor, the Grand Trunk, have put into the properties comprising the D., G. H. and M. \$25,197,530. Furthermore, this line furnishes to the Canadian National Railways a traffic route by ferry across Lake Michigan of great value and strategic importance, together with valuable Detroit terminals.

"The present administration of the Canadian National Railways has endeavored to fulfill all of its obligations to communities served in the state of Michigan and elsewhere and to the employes on its lines.

"We had no reason to assume that a material dissatisfaction existed until out of a comparatively clear sky the project to dispossess the Grand Trunk Western of the D., G. H. and M.

"It is difficult to understand the motives which may have prompted such a movement, but it would have seemed the part of wisdom and justice if any dissatisfaction existed that the proper authorities should have made the situation known to the Canadian National Railways and given us an opportunity, by negotiation or otherwise, to have corrected whatever may have given cause for complaint.

"It is not beyond the realms of speculation that one or more important trunk lines may be seeking the acquisition of the D., G. H. and M. for the purpose of forming a direct traffic connection with other trunk lines on the western side of Lake Michigan.

Will Resist

"The Canadian National Railways System desires to live in peace with its neighbors and has never pursued a policy of aggression.

"We will, with such strength as we can command, resist the exploitation of our property, relying on the justice of our cause and the reputation which we think we enjoy for fair dealing with our patrons and our employees."


