WAR ON COCKROACHES IN LONDON IS WAGED

LONDON, Mar. 11.—The cockroach has come under official ban in London, and his elimination is being sought in a drive undertaken by the College of Pestology, formerly the Vermin Repression Society. A "kill that cockroach" campaign is being started in London, and will be extended throughout the country. The cockroach swarms with bacteria and vermin which disseminate disease, aver the College of Pestology authorities, and it has been suggested that even small pox, scarlet fever and cancer as well can be broadcast in this way.

HAZELTON INDIAN GIVEN A YEAR IN PRISON FOR THEFT

Simon Fowler, a Hazelton Indian was this morning sentenced to twelve months imprisonment for theft after pleading guilty in the county court before Judge Young this morning.

He was brought from Hazelton by Chief Constable Service and took speedy trial. He was already out on suspended sentence for a former offense of a similar nature.
