

That is why it is necessary for the artist to exaggerate. The imagination has to take part in the making of the picture.

So it is in literary art. The impression conveyed by an act or a conversation or a scene is often so strong that caricature is necessary to convey that to the reader as strongly as it was felt by the writer.

At times, perhaps, this scientific aspect is overdone cich, and becomes almost tiresome. Yet there are such broad flashes of human nature running through the book from beginning to end so that is always interesting, although not sufficiently engrossing to make the reader stay up at night and devour it.

#### Book To Read And Then Set Aside.

"Arrowsmith" is not a book to read at one sitting. It is a book to read a chapter or two and then set aside. In that it resembles "Main Street." It is not a novel, has no gradual development of a theme leading to a climax. It is purely narrative and could have closed at any other place as well as at the Pass-Edward McLean. end. In that particular it is defective. As a matter of fact, Arrowsmith is subject to many criticisms and yet, in spite of that DELIGHTFUL TEA it is a book that should be read, and a book that many people will want to read. It does not follow the orthodox method. ### Efficiency Of Pep Week.

One of the characters in the book is a health director who, among other things, is fond of having weeks devoted to all sorts of objects. Telling of one of these the writer says:

"Nautilus had just held a Pep Week, during which a race of rapidly talking men, formerly book agents but now called Efficieny Engineers, went about giving advice to shopkeepers on how to get money from one another more rapidly."

In another place the author is rather discouraged over his search for truth. He soliloquizes about it like this:

"Does it really matter? Does truth matter-clean, cold unfriendly truth? Everybody says, "Oh, you mustn't tamper with the truth," and everybody is furious if you hint that they themselves are tampering with it. Does anything matter, except making love and sleeping and eating and being flattered?"

And again the author says: "They decided that most people who called themselves "truth seekers"—people who, chattering Murray: Mrs. George Rorie was of truth as though it were a tangible separable thing, like houses or salt or bread-did not so much desire to find truth as tocure their mental itch.
