City Chosen For Red Cross Conference

The northern interior regional conference of the Canadian Red Cross Society will be held in Prince Rupert on Friday, October 24.

Stan Saville, president of the Prince Rupert branch, in announcing the venue of the meeting, said Col. C. A. Scott of Vancouver, commissioner of the Society in B.C., will be among the speakers.

It will be the first time Prince Rupert has held the conference. Majority of branches in the region are on the Canadian National Railways line between Prince George and this city which eliminates any serious transportation problem.

Mr. Saville said the meeting place has not yet been decided but would be announced later.
