### EDMONTON WANTS LARGER REVENUE.

Trying to Make Alberta Government Hand Over Part of its Income

EDMONTON, Jan. 23.—There is a movement afoot here to try to make the Farmer Government of Alberta "disgorge" some portion of the taxes collected from purely municipal sources of revenue.

Edmonton is not raising sufficient revenue to meet her liabilities and the necessity of increasing taxes is before them. A rate of sixty mills on the dollar is discussed.

### IMMIGRANTS FROM MANY NATIONS AT WINNIPEG YESTERDAY

WINNIPEG, Jan. 24.—"Canada the Melting Pot" was again exemplified by the arrival at the Canadian National Station of a party of immigrants from the S.S. Megantic, numbering 39 and representative of 14 European nations. The party was met enroute to Winnipeg by interpreters of the colonization and development department and arrangements made for the journey westward of those who were travelling further than Winnipeg to reach their new homes. The nationalities represented in the party were: British, 6; Danish, 1; Norwegian, 1; Swedish, 2; Finnish, 2; Germans, 6; Hungarians, 5; Polish, 4; Roumanians, 1; Russian, 6; and Ukrainians, 5. By provinces the party was distributed as follows: British Columbia, 5; Alberta, 17; Saskatchewan, 7; and Manitoba, 10.

### ENGLISH BOYS LIKE RADIO BETTER THAN THEIR HOME LESSONS

LONDON, Jan. 24.—Radio sets are very cheap in this country and good ones can be purchased for a few dollars. Thus they are quite within reach of school boys and so great has the fad become that the headmaster of a grammar school in Bradford complains that it is causing home lessons to be skimped. He has sent out a circular letter to parents calling their attention to the serious effect listening-in is having on the work of the boys and expressing the hope that parents will strictly regulate the conditions under which wireless is used.
