



### CHINESE INVASION OF POLAND LATEST

Thousand Peddlers Come to Country Thought May be Spies

WARSAW, Poland, Mar. 20.-Fearing a so-called Chinese invasion because of the visits to this country of nearly 1,000 Orientals during the last few months, the Polish government has decided that no more Chinese will be admitted until their applications have been passed upon by the Warsaw Foreign Office. The Chinese government, is is understood, is awaiting further details of the Polish government's action before taking up the question with the Warsaw officials.

The invasion began last fall when Chinese peddlers began arriving in Warsaw with Chinese wares and curios, most of them coming by way of Berlin, where visas had been granted by the Polish consulate. Some weeks later several hundred additional Chinese applied for permission to come to Warsaw and were granted visas, and early this year there were further applicants until it is estimated that approximately 1,000 peddlers had visited the country, all representing themselves to be fradesmen.
