FIRE PROTECTION BEING CONSIDERED

Railway Officials and Government Officials held Conference at Toronto

TORONTO, Feb. 13.—One of the most representative meetings to be held in connection with the forest protection from fire will be opened today at the King Edward hotel, when experts from the Federal, Ontario and Quebec governments as well as New York State will attend the first annual forest protection meeting of the Canadian National railways.

The gathering will be presided over by C. G. Bowker, general manager and among the various subjects to be discussed will be those of the development of closer co-operation between the National railways and the various forestry organizations for the protection of the forested area in northern Ontario and Quebec, and the various methods of forest fire fighting including the development of small power pumps and railway fire tank cars.

of the possibility of determining what might be called forest fire weather, through the co-operation of the meteorological bureau. So far as railway fire protective work is concerned this is a new nature of effort to save the forest from fire loss and it is a question which has aroused deepest interest among the various forestry associations.

NATIVE AMERICANS OFTEN CHILDLESS

Small Families the Average While Immigrants Keep up Birthrate

URBANA, Ill., Feb. 13.—The size of the American family of native stock in one generation has decreased 38 1/2 per cent, according to R. E. Baber, professor of sociology at the University of Illinois, who added that today the native stock family has less than three children, while it requires four, under the present mortality and marriage rate, to replace the stock without increase.

"It is not necessarily a tragedy that much of our native stock is dying out and that our increase comes wholly from foreign stock, for foreign is certainly not synonymous with inferior," said the professor. "Yet few will admit the desirability of such rapid replacement of our native stock, for it contains some of our most precious population elements. When we see 13 per cent of our native families childless, and 48 per cent more with only one child each, it seems to be significant."

Turning to the educational side of the situation, Professor Baber declared "far too many of our educated people either side-step marriage or marry too late in life to have a family. From one half to three-fifths of our best educated women are having no share in producing the next generation, due either to non-marriage or childless marriage."

MODEL FARMS FOR PROFESSIONAL MEN BEING ARRANGED FOR

That is Plan of Empire Community Settlement Organization in Britain

LONDON, Feb. 13.—To facilitate co-operation in emigration among retired professional classes with small fixed incomes, the Empire Community Settlement has been organized here to care for retired military officers, civil servants, engineers and other professional men unfitted to go to the dominions as agricultural settlers in the ordinary way.

It is proposed to establish them overseas on model farms, something like garden cities, with two to five acres, dwelling, stable and outhouse sites, and club houses where meals may be obtained at a low rate. After five years of this life the settlers would be expected to find a permanent place in the dominion.

ing already established several state-owned enterprises, she is now about to build a meat packing plant which will supply meat at cost price to co-operative associations of butchers, and also export it.

The scheme, as recently approved, involves an outlay of \$5,000,000, to be raised by an issue of 6 1/2% bonds. The enterprise will be "an autonomous dependency of the state" to be administered by a board of 12 directors, seven to be named by the government and the rest by the cattle raising interests.
