

Hudson Bay Mountain Mining Properties Being Developed by Alfred C. Garde and others

(Second of Series of Articles on Mining in Bulkley Valley, based on Smithers Board of Trade Report)

Alfred C. Garde, the well known mining engineer of Smithers and formerly of Prince Rupert has been developing for the Eastern bondholders a group of claims in Hudson Bay Mountain known as the Rico-Aspen group on Silver Peak of Hudson Bay Mountain close to Evelyn Station. The property was owned by Joseph Fisher and Joseph Sheedy, two old time prospectors, now dead, and the bond is from their estate. Extensive development was carried on during 1924, the latest work being the completion of the tunnel to cross-cut the main vein at depth. This reached the vein in August and was afterwards continued along the vein for 50 feet, a good shoof of ore being encountered. The principal showings exhibit high values in silver and lead.

Canadian Citizen

At Seymour Lake, two miles south of Smithers, while engaged in construction work on the Duthie Mines Road in 1923, John J. Costello discovered and located the Canadian Citizen claim, to which he has since added three others. Various other claims have been located in the vicinity on account of Costello's find. This is a mineralized zone of considerable width with values in gold, silver and copper. Work was carried on in both 1923 and 1924 to open up the lead, with encouraging results, and the owners intend to continue development in 1925. The situation of the discovery affords great advantages, the workings being only one hundred yards from an automobile road and a mile and a half from the shipping point on the railway.

Silver Creek

The Silver Creek and Homestake Groups, owned by Peter Schuifer and partners, are located on the summit of the Silver Creek Pass, Hudson Bay Mountain, and reached by trail from Lake Kathlyn Station, eight miles away. There are several fine showings, one a vein with high grade silver-lead ore, another being of zinc of which a very large body is in evidence. Some years ago a shipment of high grade ore was made from the silver-lead vein giving returns of \$175 per ton. Although little work has been done in recent years this is a prospect likely to turn out well.

Carroll Property

During the past two seasons, Philip J. Job has consistently and successfully developed the Carroll Group, purchased by him. This is a silver-lead property and results have been such that development is likely to proceed on a larger scale in 1925.

Lake-view

Near the Silver Creek property Olof Hanson and associates have a group known as the Lake-view.





Mayor Not Satisfied with Letter from Provincial Government Though Ald. Stephens is

A letter from D. ditions were satisfactory. No other members of the council made comment and the letter was ordered filed.

The letter said, among other things, that it was not the desire of the liquor control board to interfere in the municipalities providing the laws were being observed satisfactorily under the supervision of the local police; that the act, however, must be strictly enforced, and that it was contrary to the policy of the board to disclose to the public the work of its secret police. In explanation of the deductions that had been complained of in Prince Rupert, the communication stated that they covered the period between October 1, 1923, and September 31, 1924, during which time provincial liquor officers had done considerable work in Prince Rupert resulting in prosecutions being launched and convictions obtained in the police court. The deductions were certified for by the comptroller general of the province.

Not Satisfied

"In my opinion," stated Mayor Newton, "the explanations are only camouflage. Deductions were previously made to cover the work done in 1923. There is nothing to show what was done by the provincial officers in 1924. This letter cannot fairly claim that the deduction of \$3,300 in 1924 was justified. I can only say that I am dissatisfied with the explanations offered. However, neither I nor any body else

expect that any satisfaction would be derived from the inquiry made by last year's council in this matter, so there is nothing else to do but to file this communication."

"As far as I can see, a satisfactory explanation of the deductions is made in the letter," asserted Ald. Stephens.

could unload its property, it would clear the road for active development that would result to the general benefit of the city.

Mayor Newton explained that the disposal of tax sale lots had been a knotty problem for the past two councils. The policy had been adopted to accept available offers except in extreme circumstances. He would suggest that this matter be referred to the finance committee at least for report. The only solution he saw was to accept the best offers that the market afforded and get the lots off the hands of the city.

Whole Situation

A suggestion was offered by Ald. Stephens and approved by Ald. Larsen that the city advertise all its lots for sale. Ald. Casey asked that any such action as this be refrained from until the finance committee had been given the opportunity of making an intelligent and comprehensive

report on the situation.

The discussion closed with the adoption of Ald. Casey's motion that the particular bids in question be referred to the finance committee for report.
