HALIBUT PRICES ARE HIGH TODAY

Eighteen Cents Paid For Fish Here Today; Arrivals Few

Much to the satisfaction of the fishermen operating the few boats that marketed fares, high prices were once again the order at the Fish Exchange this morning. Americans averaged over 18c and 6c, while the one Canadian boat received two cents less for first class and the same for second. Five boats marketed 50,500 pounds as follows:
