### MEN COMING HERE TO SEEK EMPLOYMENT BUT LITTLE IS OFFERING

Logging and Pole Camps Expected to Open in About a Month

Every boat and train brings a few men to the city seeking employment on the elevator and other construction work which is in prospect. So far however, there has been little demand. The city has a good gang on at roadwork but they are the Prince Rupert people who are getting first consideration.

Most of the men coming seem to have a little money and are not badly in need.

A few carpenters were sent to the mill at the beginning of the week but so far there is little demand for labor in the city.

The logging and pole camps will not be opened up for about a month yet. There is about six feet of snow at many points in the interior and that makes pole cutting almost impossible.

As soon as this snow is gone work will proceed. Work on the island will open, it is expected at about the same time.

Program For Coming Season Was Discussed at Meeting Last Evening

A meeting of the Prince Rupert Parent Teachers' Association was held in the Booth Memorial School last evening. Mrs. Spencer presided and there was a fairly good attendance of members.
