## HEAD SQUEEZERS AMAZON BASIN

Dr. McGovern Will Try to Find Out How Crania Are Reduced

LONDON, May 13.—Efforts to solve the mystery of the "human head squeezers," a tribe of which almost nothing is known and which lives in the wilds of the mountains between the main Amazon basin and the northern Andes, is to be one of the aims of an exploring expedition to South America to be made next summer by Dr. William M. McGovern, one of England's most daring anthropologists. Dr. McGovern, who was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., visited Lhasa, the forbidden city of Tibet, disguised as a Buddhist monk, last year, and has headed numerous other expeditions in various parts of the world in the interest of anthropological research work.

The "human head squeezers" who have a way of reducing the heads of their victims to the size of a person's fist, according to Dr. McGovern, also are supposed to be the possessors of gold and diamond mines in their native haunts just to the north of the Amazon jungles. The Londoner plans to spend seven to ten months in their midst, studying their habits and customs. No white man has ever solved the process of how heads are reduced in size without so much as disfiguring any of the victim's features and in the interest of science Dr. McGovern hopes to be able to overcome this riddle in the course of his explorations of this tribe and its haunts.

### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENTS

PRE-EMPTIONS. Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional on residence, occupation and improvement for agricultural purposes.

Full information concerning regulations regarding pre-emption is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Government Agent.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emption are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner.

Pre-emption must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be received.

### PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands."

### HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed.

### LEASES

For grazing and industrial purposes areas not exceeding 640 acres may be leased, by one person or a company.

### GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the ranges administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given to established owners. Stock-owners may form associations for range management. Free, or partly free, permits are available for settlers, campers and travellers, up to ten head.

In 1921 Lord Milner married

ministrative services in South Africa and in addition to being created a viscount he was made governor of the Transvaal and Orange River Colony as well as being appointed high commissioner in 1905 and as his party was at that time out of power he retired to his estates.

When David Lloyd George became prime minister in December, 1916, Lord Milner entered the cabinet as minister without portfolio. He became minister for war in 1918 and the next year was named secretary of state for the colonies. The manner in which he handled the Irish situation, which had become acute, did not satisfy the Conservatives of the Coalition government or the Irish factions and he resigned in February, 1921.

Lord Milner was created a Knight of the Garter by royal warrant, being at that time the only member not of royal birth. He was born March 23, 1854, the son of Dr. Charles Milner, a country physician of moderate circumstances. After the son had completed his elementary education an opportunity was offered to him to travel in Germany, where he continued his studies. Upon his return to England he entered Balliol College, Oxford, to study law, received his M.A. degree and was entered at Temple Bar in 1881.
