# TO PATROL FISHERIES

Defeated in Senate by Vote of 156 to 134 on Confidence Vote

PARIS, April 11. - The French cabinet was defeated on a vote of 156 to 134 in a vote of confidence taken in the Senate last night.

As a result of the defeat the Herriot government tendered its resignation to President Demourgue, who accepted it but requested the Premier and his colleagues to carry on until their successors are appointed.

The defeat of the government will probably see the end of the cabinet levy proposal.
