

TO BROADCAST

Party Will Travel From Philadelphia to Portland by Canadian National.

MONTREAL, July 3.—Philadelphia Elks to the number of 375 will reach Montreal on Monday morning next on two special trains operated over the lines of the Canadian National Railways, and after a brief period of sight-seeing and exchange of fraternal greetings with members of the Canadian Elks, the special trains will resume the journey towards the Pacific coast. The party of Elks who have selected the Canadian National route to the west will be headed towards Portland, Ore., where the annual convention of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is to be held.

The first section of the Elks' special will leave Philadelphia at 5.30 o'clock next Sunday afternoon and will arrive at Bonaventure station at 8.15 on Monday morning. After breakfast the travellers will be free to visit the sights and shrines of Montreal and will then return to their trains so as to allow of their departure at 2.30 o'clock in the afternoon with Ottawa as the second Canadian objective, arriving at the capital after a three-hour run.

While in Ottawa the Elks' entertainers will provide the first of three special broadcasts which will be given on their travels through Canada and for which stations on the radio department of the Canadian National railways will be used. Special permission has been given by the radio branch of the department of marine and fisheries for the use of C.N.R.C.

On Monday night with the Elks will travel a brass band, a string band and a number of vocalists and instrumentalists, soloists, etc., as well as other entertainers, and from these performers groups have been selected to present the Canadian radio program.

The brass band consists of sixty selected musicians and the string band has thirty players and each will offer popular selections and for the final number on the program will join forces.

ARGENTITE ORE FROM  
LAKEVIEW MINE WAS  
TAKEN OUT THIS WEEK

Flurry of Interest at Stewart Over Twelve Inch Vein of Good Looking Silver

A flurry of interest this week was created when miners from the Lakeview exhibited samples of ore containing argentite and ruby silver, as well as some native, says the Portland Canal News. This ore comes from a 12-inch vein encountered at 751 feet from the portal of the cross-cut tunnel. The strike of the vein is east and west and dip nearly vertical.

Six veins which do not show on the surface were crossed in the course of driving this tunnel and will be explored later by drifting. The vein at 751 is now being drifted upon both ways, this work having started today.

The fact of the long tunnel is now 789 feet from the portal, and 27 feet more should bring it vertically under the outcrop of the vein which it was started to tap.

Assay samples from the 751 vein, from which all specimens showing native silver, argentite or ruby were discarded, carry excellent values.

FINE ORE SAMPLES  
KITSALT RIVER MINE

Work Being Done on Property by Kitsalt Mining &amp; Development Co.

Some fine large samples of ore from the Matilda property, owned by the Kitsalt River Mining and Development Co., were brought to Alice Arm on Thursday by Messrs. O. Flint and S. Wenerstrom, says the Alice Arm Herald.

These specimens, some of which weigh over 50 pounds are very highly mineralized, and prove conclusively that the Matilda is a property well worth developing. The ore is chiefly silver-lead, but also carries considerable zinc. Good gold values have also been obtained from Matilda ore at different times.

The samples were taken from an open cut on the surface from a vein 4½ feet wide. This vein has had a 30 foot crosscut tunnel driven on it, and the ore drifted on 5 feet. Open cuts have also been made both above and below the tunnel. This vein will be developed by the company this summer, and work will commence early next month. Other ore bodies are also known to exist on the property and these also will probably be developed this year.

A horse trail will be built up the hill from the Homestead trail thus eliminating the climb over the Vanguard hill.

DIAMOND DRILLING  
BEGINS ON BUSH MINE

Diamond drilling commenced this week on the Bush property, adjoining the B.C. Silver on the north and controlled by National Silver Mines Ltd., says the Portland Canal News. Results will be awaited with great interest locally as well as on the outside, as the property is known to have a number of attractive surface showings and is believed to carry the northeastern extension of the Premier and B.C. Silver ore zone. Boyles Bros. (Canada) Ltd., who have done practically all the diamond drilling in this camp, have the contract on the Bush.
