TARIFF CHANGE IS NOT LIKELY

Flexible Clause Gives President Power to Raise or Lower as It Is

NO ACTION ON SUGAR

WASHINGTON, July 3. —(By Canadian Press).—Much significance is attached here to the action of President Coolidge in refusing to lower the duty on sugar under the flexible tariff law, despite the fact a majority of the members of the tariff commission favored the reduction.

The reason given by the President is that the price of refined sugar is back practically to the level of pre-war days. However, the report was submitted to him July 31, 1924, when the price of sugar was higher than it has been this spring.

No Lowering Probable

The meaning of the decision given by the President, as interpreted here, is that the administration does not intend to make any extensive use of the flexible tariff provisions of the tariff act to lower duties. It has been quite plain ever since President Coolidge came into office that he would align himself with the high tariff leaders. The ruling in the case of sugar more

than ever emphasizes this. It is especially in point because sugar is a product used by every family in the land and the lowering of the duty and the probable lowering of price as a result would affect every housewife's grocery bill.

The question of whether the flexible tariff is to be used freely to increase rates will probably be more clearly illuminated when the President passes on applications for increases of rates on several commodities now pending. These are butter, straw hats, gold leaf and cotton warp knit fabrics, including cotton loves.

Disposition of the administration not to lower duties, despite findings of the tariff commission, is of peculiar moment just now, inasmuch as the Republican organization leaders in Congress, backed by the administration, are saying there will be no revision of the tariff next session.
