NEW BOOKLET WELL RECEIVED

Many Compliments and Acknowledgements from Prominent People on the Public Relation

The Board of Trade received commendations and acknowledgements in regard to the booklet recently published jointly by the city council and the Board of Trade on Prince Rupert as the Pacific outlet to the Peace River country and also giving full data in regard to Prince Rupert and district. The letters read or mentioned at the Board of Trade meeting last night were from Sir Henry Thornton, the agent general in London, the minister of the interior, the minister of railways, the minister of customs and excise, the minister of agriculture, the minister of public works, the minister of defence, the Babson Institute, Shiels Traffic Service, Vancouver Publicity Bureau, Vancouver Tourist Bureau, the Minister of Railways and Canals, the minister of trade and commerce, the Prime Minister, and the minister of justice.

The letter from Hon. Charles Stewart, minister of the interior, is typical. He says: "I have your letter of the 14th instant with respect to the question of a railway outlet from the Peace River country to the Pacific Coast and also the accompanying map showing the various routes to connect with the existing railways, and I wish to thank the Prince Rupert Board of Trade for the suggestions and information submitted."

"Personally, I am interested in any route that will open up this country to the westward. I am not particularly in favor of the route via Brule because I think it would direct traffic eastward before directing it toward the coast."

"I am at present trying to get all the information I can to place before the railway companies and will continue to press for an outlet westward. Farming will never be a very profitable undertaking in this northern part of Alberta until the settlers are furnished with this westward railway extension."

"Under your present tariff a passenger at Montreal, for instance cannot buy a summer excursion to Prince Rupert and return at the same price as to Vancouver. This is clearly unfair. Further a passenger might wish to get to Alaska via Prince Rupert and return, yet you do not give him the benefit of what you claim it costs you to take care of him between here and Vancouver. Your actions are inconsistent. We do not object to the thirteen dollar charge if one wishes to include the boat trip to Vancouver.
