Guy Fawkes Day In History.

This is the Fifth of November, the day on which discovery was made of a plot to blow up the houses of parliament in England along with the King and his chief statesmen. The plot was discovered and as a result a great many lost their lives, the innocent with the guilty. It was supposed to be a Catholic plot against a Protestant king. As a result Protestants for many years celebrated the discovery of the plot by the setting off of fireworks, burning Guy Fawkes in effigy and other similar manifestations and special services were held in Protestant churches appropriate to the occasion.

The Gunpowder Plot was an incident in the political life of the times and had no special significance. It was political as well as religious. Today the young people know nothing of it, and it is well that they do not. In those days Catholics and Protestants were equally reckless. There was a religious hate pervading the atmosphere of the country which is wholly contrary to religious precept. Today we have largely forgotten that and we now recognize that it is the privilege of any person to worship in his own way or not to worship at all if he sees fit. The reign of freedom is not yet fully inaugurated but it is being ushered in and a few more generations of development should see religious oppression, either Catholic or Protestant or any other wholly removed.

Ku Klux Klan Not Wanted Here.

According to an article taken from a Vancouver newspaper and published in this paper today, a branch of the infamous Ku Klux Klan is being formed in Vancouver. The organization is one that in some parts of the United States has taken the law into its own hands and the result has been anything but beneficial to the development of the democratic spirit. Injustice is often done and the passions and prejudices of the people are aroused.

It is hardly reasonable to expect that the Klan will get much of a foothold in this country. It originated in the negro states for the purpose of protecting the white residents against the negroes who had just been freed from the bonds of slavery and who had had no training in self-government. It is not suited to a free people and should not be tolerated in Canada. Its introduction is bound to arouse ill-feeling.

KU KLUX KLAN MEETING AT SHAUGHNESSY HEIGHTS VANCOUVER TO ORGANIZE

and located at the foot of the cross was resting a drawn sword and an open Bible.

During the evening several autos from Bellingham arrived with American Klansmen, who gave the American salute to the flag, and then the Fascisti or old Roman salute, with extended arm, to the Klazik. Later the American Klansmen donned their robes and hoods.

Qualifications for membership in the Klan were explained to be of the white race, Gentile, a Protestant, good morals; reputations and vocations respectable; exemplary habits; sound minds, and an age limit of 18 years.

The order was described as "an institution of Chivalry, Humanity, Justice and Patriotism, embodying in its genius and principles all that is chivalrous in conduct, noble in sentiment, generous in manhood and patriotic in purpose."

From the lectures it was gathered that the Klan will be strongly anti-Oriental, and will make a special drive against drug traffickers.

Copies of an "Imperial Proclamation" to the "lovers of Law, Order, Peace and Justice of all Nations, Peoples, Tribes and Tongues of the whole earth," inviting all who could qualify to become citizens of the "Invisible Empire," were handed out, together with the Canadian Ku Klux Creed, which reads as follows:

"We, the order of the Canadian Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, most humbly and reverently acknowledge the majesty and supremacy of Almighty God, and do acknowledge His goodness and graciousness through Jesus Christ our Lord."

"Conscious of the glorious heritages which have come down through the ages to us who are of the Anglo-Saxon race, and appreciative of the proud position we hold among the nations of the world through the right which has been obtained for our noble land by the blood of her people, the unquestioned freedom and supremacy which fought and conquered."

"We shall ever devote our most valiant efforts in the defense of the ideals for which our glorious Empire has fought for and conquered."

"We recognize the distinction between the races of mankind as decreed by the Creator, and we shall ever be true to the maintenance of 'White Supremacy,' and strenuously oppose any compromise thereof."

"We avow ourselves steadfast in our respect for law and order, and shall ever strive to uphold these precepts as part of our creed."

"We pledge ourselves honorably in practical fraternal relationship among men of kindred thought, purposes and ideals, and appreciate the infinite benefits accruing therefrom."

"We shall faithfully devote ourselves to the practice of honorable clanishness that the life of each may be a constant blessing to others."

"Non Silba Sed Antha."

Another highly-worded document, headed "I am the Canadian Ku Klux Klan," says: "I am the searchlight on a lofty tower." "I run my relentless eye to and fro throughout the land; my piercing glance penetrates the brooding places of iniquity. I plant my eyes and ears in the whispering corridors of crime. Wherever men gather furtively together, there am I, an austere and Invisible presence. I am the Recording Angel's Proxy."

"When I invade the fetid dens of infamy there is a sudden scampering, as of rats forsaking a doomed ship. I am the haunting dread of the depraved, and the hated Nemesis of the vicious."

"When the Law is weak, then I am strong. When Justice stands impotent, and dumb, then do I speak with majesty and power. I am an outstretched arm to Society's unrequited victim—the swift avenger of Innocence despoiled."

"My voice is the sound of many waters. Sometimes it ruffles in mighty wrath until it mingles the thunders and roars of Niagara. Sometimes it sinks to the still, sad music of consolation and sympathy. Always and ever I speak for the sanctity of the home, for a stainless flag and for the preservation of these benign institutions of the free."

"Corrupt politicians, despoil-

ers of the State, seek to quench my light and still my voice."

"I am a bulwark and bell-tower of Democracy. Within my realms Dives relinquishes his millions and Lazarus his rags. The poor man here is as rich as the richest, and the rich man as poor as the pauper. I know but one distinction, and that unsullied manhood."

"I am the burning beacon in the uplifted hand of Liberty. I am the sword and huckler of that mightily invisible Emperor of all free people—Justice."

"My symbols are the Fiery Cross and the scintillating, stainless Flag."

"The foe of Vice, the friend of Innocence, the rod and staff of Law. I am the Canadian Ku Klux Klan."

To enquiries, Major Powell stated that the Klan already had a large membership, but that he could not divulge the names of any members, although they themselves were privileged to do this if they thought necessary.

During the evening, however, one speaker declared that "more than one of those elected on Thursday were members of the Klan," but did not say whether the words referred to local seats or not.

It was announced that a public meeting in the Hotel Vancouver ballroom would be held shortly, and that an open-air Konklave, at which the Fiery Cross would be raised, would also be held in Vancouver. A second Konklave, at which Canadian Knights will be invited, will also be held at Lynden, Washington, in the near future.

Application blanks handed out bore a pledge under which the applicant bound himself to a "strict and loyal obedience" at all times to the Klan, and to "willingly accept as my portion whatever penalty your authority may impose" if the signer proves "untrue as a Klansman."

Each application must be accompanied by the "required donation," which was stated to be \$10.
