Interesting Insight Into Career of Famous Poet Given by Mrs. Adams Beck

Glorious Apollo, the new book by E. Barrington, is a fictional story of the life of Lord Byron. In some respects it is a horrible story in that it traces the gradual downfall of the great poet. In that respect it resembles the famous boy's story, "Eric or Little by Little."

The foibles and fancies of the poet are described in some detail; and yet with a touch that eliminates much of their grossness. It gives the inspiration for his various poems and all woven together makes a novel that is inlensely interesting even if at times slightly disgusting.
