## DOUBLE OUTPUT BEEF CATTLE

Edmonton District Expects to Ship  
20,000 Head of Stock this  
Year to England

EDMONTON, Oct. 1.—If present plans are followed out the Livestock producers of Canada, the big feeding and exporting company which has its feeding headquarters at Edmonton, will during the coming winter double the scale of its operations locally which means that at least 20,000 head of cattle will be exported from the Edmonton district in the course of the next season. This is the statement of H. P. Kennedy of Toronto, president of the company, who with its vice-president, T. J. Irwin of Glasgow, has been in the city for the past few days, in conference with local officials of the firm.

This attitude on the part of the company indicates that they have every confidence in the Edmonton district as a source of the sort of cattle with which they are supplying the British markets. Some of the best cattle which ever entered British ports came right from Edmonton during the last winter, states Mr. Kennedy and the supply in this part of the province is still unlimited. In addition to this, Alberta has the best climate for outdoor feeding and an abundance of cheap coarse grains, as a result of which cattle can be fattened here which will command a premium over any entering Great Britain.

## COMMUNISM SPENT FORCE IN BRITAIN

British Labor Party Thinks  
Arming of Proletariat so  
Much Piffle

LONDON, Oct. 1.—There will be no "red" revolution in Great Britain next spring, nor any other time. Communism in Great Britain is a spent force and all talk of class warfare and the arming of the proletariat are "so much piffle."

These are the replies of spokesmen for the British Labor party and the general council of the Trades Union congress to open attempts being made by A. J. Cook, secretary of the Miners' Federation, and Albert Inkpen, secretary of the Communist party, to provoke civil war in Great Britain next spring simultaneously with a great industrial tie-up.

### Says Reds Are Tied

"Communism has no longer much capacity for making mischief within the labor and the trade union movement of this country," declared J. R. Clynes, deputy leader of the Labor party in the House of Commons, and Lord Privy Seal in the late Labor government. "The Communist leaders seem now to be employed in trying to make our flesh creep, but their lurid talk of revolution and mutiny, which grows more forcible as their influence wanes, excites more attention outside the Labor movement than it does within it."

"The Communists have really done the Labor movement a service by publishing their hysterical demand for a campaign of sedition and disaffection among the soldiers and sailors. The whole Labor movement will be with us in disavowing any sympathy with this childish talk of violence and mutiny."

Fred Branley, secretary to the general council of the Trades Union congress, of which Communists are attempting to obtain control, was even more emphatic in dashing the Communist hopes to the ground.

### War Talk "Piffle"

"To talk boldly about class warfare, a working class army, and the arming of the proletariat, is so much piffle," he said. "Any man who went into an ordinary trade union meeting and aired views about ammunition and guns would be set down as crazy—no doubt rightly."

### Conditions Different

"I express the opinion quite deliberately and emphatically that if the Russian workers had been granted constitutional rights and political freedom, as we enjoy them here, the history of that country would have been totally different."

## AIR MAIL TO SAVE TEN DAYS BETWEEN INDIA AND BRITAIN

LONDON, Oct. 1.—A weekly mail service between England and India is being undertaken by the Imperial Airways, Limited, through a subsidy and a five-year contract given by the air ministry. Mails will be delivered in Bombay in five days against the present 15 days, and when the service comes into regular operation next summer passengers also will be carried. At the outset passengers will only be carried between Cairo and Basra. The route, just under 2,500 miles in length, will be from Kantara via Ramleh and Amman to Bagdad, thence to Basra and Karachi. To prevent forced landings, especially designed three-engined aircraft will be used.
