Provision Made for Use of Old K. of P. Hall For Children's Games

The use of the old K. of P. hall in the Helgeson Block has been secured by the Student's Council of the High School for the purpose of training in volleyball, basketball and badminton. Principal Brady reported to the school board last night. For this the rent will be \$7 a month for the season, the light and any required fixtures to be paid for by the tenants. On request of Principal Brady the board decided to meet the cost of the rent, the student's council to pay all other expenses.

In reporting the matter, the principal of the High School explained that there was no provision at the High School for indoor games and he thought "the board might look on this as part of the education of the children. The proposal was to use the hall in the afternoons between four and six under supervision of the teachers and also on Saturdays.
