Mr. Dale led the six of spades, the queen went up on Mr. Muzzy's right and he promptly won with the king. At this point he carefully examined his own hand and dummy and counted his taking tricks several times. For this he was a little late.

Even if the heart finesse were successful he had only two heart tricks, one spade, four diamonds and a club in quick winners. There was nothing for it but to try the club finesse — and that had to be taken toward Mrs. Keen.

He led a small club, finessed the jack and Mrs. Keen won with the king. A spade was returned and Mr. Dale ran off five tricks in that suit for a two-trick set.

Mr. Champion gritted his teeth. "Muzzy," he said, "why do you have to bid no trump all the time? Open your hand with a club — or anything — and let me bid no trump and play the hand."

"You bid your hand and I'll bid mine," Mr. Muzzy retorted cleverly. "Look, Muzzy," continued Mr. Champion with feigned patience, "you have to make a hold-up play on the first trick. Don't play your king of spades. Let Mrs. Keen win with the queen."

"What?" yelled Mr. Muzzy, horrified, "and have her lead back a spade right through my king?"
Mr. Champion's phony patience vanished. "I'm not asking you to play the JACK of spades on the first trick, man," he screamed. "You'd play your small one, Mrs. Keen's spade return would be through your king — ACK — an automatic stopper, with the queen gone."
"It wouldn't matter whether Dale won with his ace or not. When Mrs. Keen got in with the king of clubs she wouldn't have another spade to lead. Don't you see that?"

"Well," said Mr. Muzzy, ending the argument, "I still say I would have made the game if the King of clubs had been right."
