URGES EXEMPT BIG ELEVATORS

Vancouver Paper Scores Council of That City for Refusing to Submit Bylaw

(Vancouver Star) Last Friday, when the Vancouver council decided not to resubmit to the ratepayers the elevator improvements tax exemption bylaw, it failed in its duty to the people.

It is the duty of the council to study just such problems. It is its duty to come to considered conclusions and then to give to the people a clear lead; and, if that lead is not at first accepted, it still remains its duty to stand by its convictions and to carry on a campaign of courageous education until the people accept its views.

The by-law proposed to give to private elevators erected in Vancouver and having a capacity of over 500,000 bushels, exemption from taxation on improvements only for a period of ten years.

Victoria voted in favor of complete exemption for a period of 60 years, by 2470 to 131; and two elevators are about to be erected there. New Westminster is prepared not only to grant exemption, but also to assist in financing construction.
